Growing Young

Over the years, I have had the privilege to be the pastor for a tremendous group of young people and young adults. First Baptist Church of New Bern has produced a stellar group of individuals who are living out their faith daily through being teachers, engineers, doctors, realtors, lawyers and many other positions including pastors. The congregation should be proud of the faith that they have instilled in our young people throughout the years that has led them to make a difference for God in the world. We want to continue that tradition of ministry.

Our church wants to continue our calling to help guide our young people toward their vocational calling based upon the Christian principles instilled in them by their church and their family. That is a goal of FBC's Growing Young program.

The nine members of the Growing Young Team met with me monthly to study, learn and dream about instituting the Growing Young program at First Baptist Church of New Bern. Throughout the Fall, on Wednesday nights, I will be leading an introduction to the concepts of Growing Young with our congregation using video and spoken word. There are six key core concepts that congregations who are growing young exhibit. As we hope to grow and maintain the ministries to and with younger adults (especially aged 19 - 29), we will evaluate how we are doing in each of these areas.

The Growing Young Core Commitments are as follows:

- 1. Unlock keychain leadership.
- 2. Empathize with today's young people.
- 3. Take Jesus' message seriously.
- 4. Fuel a warm community.
- 5. Prioritize young people (and families) everywhere.
- 6. Be the best neighbors.

Over the weekend of September 10-12, Rev. Andy Jung will meet with our deacons and with our congregation to introduce the concepts of Growing young. Rev. Jung will speak to our deacons at our annual retreat on September 11. He will then preach at both morning worship services on September 12 and lead a joint Sunday School class for all youth and adult classes on that same day at 10:00 AM in the FLC.

Following this kickoff weekend, each **Wednesday night throughout** the Fall, I will try to flesh out what these Core Commitments mean for our church and congregation. I hope that you will join us for these key events in the life of our church.



The Key Ingredient and Praying with Understanding

The Power of Prayer, Part III



Have you ever left out an ingredient when baking cookies, perhaps not including the sugar? What a disappointment as you have to start all over. When we pray, God has a perfect plan for opening our hearts to Him – opening with His Word. Justin Cornwell shares in his book, <u>Praying the Scriptures</u>, that there are 650+ prayers in the Bible! Examples of how we should commune with Him, even as our hearts are closed through pain, worry, anxiousness, are in scripture. God's heart is ever open!

Praying God's words back to Him adds the needed ingredients:

- **Vigor** is added to our words. "The word of God is living and powerful – sharper than any two-edged sword, pruning even to the division of the soul and spirit and joints and marrow and is the discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart." Hebrews 4:12.
- **Verification** that God truly is speaking to you. Just as our children often need assurance that we are supporting them, we need that link to and from God. We more clearly recognize the voice of God the more we study His word.
- Vocabulary in the Bible is full of emotion the book of Psalms expresses every human feeling known to man. Scripture wakes up our soul. Cornwell sums it up best – "When we want to speak to God, we pray. When we want God to speak to us, we search the scriptures.

We don't have to be a rocket scientist to pray, but we do have to have a measure of "spiritual intelligence". Through our trust and confidence in the Father, we must repeat His words back to Him as we pray, (much like a poem you are trying to memorize.) The Bible is God's textbook, how He draws us with understanding towards Him. In Psalm 138:2, David declares, "For You have magnified Your word above all Your name".

As human beings, we can convince ourselves through our thoughts to believe a certain thing. Scripture changes our hearts. We receive assurance that God will "do what we ask in HIs name" John 14:14. We gain authority *with* God and in our trust in Him, and also gain authority *over* evil.

Our understanding of who answers our prayers is important. Cornwell points towards four persons involved when we pray. God is the **provider**, the source of our needs. Jesus is our **intercessor**, linking us to the Father. Additionally is the Holy Spirit, the **implementor** of God's will. This is the key piece in our connection to God. Lastly, the angels, in a subdued manner, act as **activators** of answered prayer, giving us a snapshot of His will.

Scripture provides the knowledge we need to communicate effectively with God, giving our prayers clearer understanding of our needs and God's response to those needs. What joy can await when we are restored and reassured of His promises through His word!
